CRPF JOIN HANDS WITH AIIMS, DELHI IN ORGAN DONATION CAMPAIGN

Central Reserve Police force is committed to serve the nation and its citizens. The motto of 'Service and Loyalty' is imbibed, not just in the professional culture of the force, but is deeply rooted in the moral fabric of its personnel. Their endeavor to serve humanity in all possible ways has been repeatedly illustrated in the plethora of instances when the internal security warriors of CRPF have stepped beyond their duty to help the fellow citizens by rendering them help during the times of need, providing them medical assistance, donating blood on a large scale etc. The force is being lauded for its contribution in the fight against the COVID-19 epidemic, and its public centric approach in walking extra miles to aid the countrymen in need.

Maheshwari, DG CRPF on the eve of Independence Day in a webinar that was graced by Dr (Prof) Randeep Guleria, Director AIIMS, Dr (Prof) Aarti Vij, Head ORBO and the force personnel and their families across the nation.

Dr. A. P. Maheshwari, DG CRPF commenced this noble campaign by submitting his Organ donation Form online and remarked that CRPF personnel have a history of coming forward for noble causes which is a matter of immense pride. Dr (Prof) Randeep Guleria, Director AIIMS in his address underlined the potential of Organ Donation in improving quality of life for many people and lauded CRPF for being at the forefront of organ donation. He thanked CRPF for launching this force wide campaign. Dr (Prof) Aarti Vij, Head ORBO gave an educational presentation on Organ Donation.

This campaign will augment the Organ donation efforts by creating awareness, dispelling fears, and attesting the acceptability of organ donation as a norm. To this end, the force has collaborated with the healthcare fraternity in AIIMS, ORBO. The doctors from AIIMS will work in synergy with CRPF doctors to organize webinars, seminars, workshops and awareness videos to encourage enthusiastic participation of CRPF personnel for the noble and humane cause. This will be an online exercise by which personnel will be able to pledge donation of eyes, skin, lungs, heart, liver, pancreas, kidney, heart valves, intestine and blood vessels.

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
