

CRPF's 2850 Km Kanyakumari to Raj Ghat Cycle Rally flagged off

The Central Reserve Police Force flagged off a Kanyakumari to Rajghat Cycle Rally from Gandhi Mandapam Kanyakumari, Tamilnadu today to celebrate the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav which is an initiative of the Government of India to celebrate and commemorate 75 years of progressive India and the glorious history of its people, culture and achievements. All Department and Ministries will host a set of activities for a resurgent, Aatmanirbhar Bharat. To mark the momentous occasion and honor the warriors of freedom struggle, Central Reserve Police Force, is organizing several functions, in its all 400 static and 1200 field establishments with full zeal and enthusiasm.

Thiru T. Mano Thanaraj, Minister of Information and Technology, Govt of Tamilnadu, flagged off the rally at Gandhi Mandapam Kanyakumari in presence of local prominent leaders, dignitaries, senior officers and men of the Force. The rally will culminate at Raj Ghat on 2nd October 2021, covering a total distance of 2850 km.
