

WORKSHOP ON INTERNAL SECURITY

25/06/2019 to 29/06/2019

India is facing a mix of traditional and non-traditional security challenges, and the line between the two is getting increasingly blurred. What were earlier considered developmental issues, like environmental protection and conservation, are today being seen through the prism of internal security. While the traditional security challenges remain live, their potency has increased manifold. Non-state actors like organized crime syndicates or terror outfits breed in states where governance is weak.

It is surprising that although India faces a multitude of serious challenges in this aspect, national internal security is seldom an electoral issue. The debate on internal security is often narrow, ill-informed, shrill and partisan. Information is scarce and people find it difficult to form a well –considered opinion. Only a narrow community of so-called strategic affairs experts indulges in internal security debates. Fortunately, people still have a positive image of the armed forces so the general belief is that at the end of the day the country is safe in their hands.

The Workshop on ‘Internal Security’ is to serve as a platform for critically reviewing the security situations across the conflict zones and to discuss contemporary scenario and emerging trends by national internal security experts, collectively exchange relevant ideas and experiences by ground commanders and hoping to raise awareness about India’s Internal security non-traditional issues and challenges in this area with emphasis on imparting general understanding and framing solutions.
